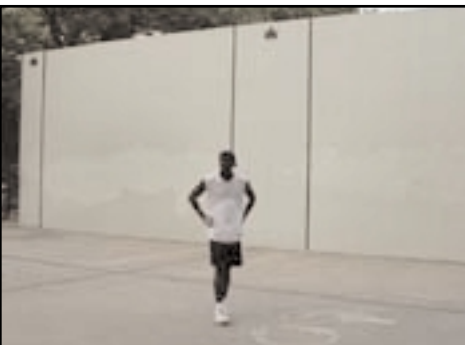


## Christian Claims His Second 2003 B Singles Handball Title
